A Note From the President



Every day the news reminds us that the universe we inhabit is an extremely dangerous place. People of various cultures, religions, and nationalities live in serious conflicts and under constant fears and threats. The politicians have not been able to bring about a lasting peace to our world, and academics have proven less than able to bridge the divide of such conflicts. It is now time for the artists, perhaps, to encourage collaborations, dialogues, and negotiation.

As Iranian-American artists and educators, we believe in making use of the persuasive power of arts to communicate shared principles of love and compassion in building bridges of understanding, tolerance, and reconciliation. With this in mind, Festival Cinema Invisible (FCI) was founded following the Iranian Green Movement and the Arab Spring in 2011.

FCI is a not-for-profit organization committed to facilitating a medium for Middle Eastern artists and filmmakers to share their creative works with their American colleagues, while introducing international community to the art and culture of a region they are less likely to be familiar with.

Stressing the human similarities and cultural congruencies, FCI aims to offer an environment conducive to understanding of "the self" and "the other," as well as a shared personal and cultural experience. Therefore, we hope to make a contribution, however minimal, to understanding, appreciation, and acceptance among people that may otherwise be conflicted. FCI aspires to introduce film, video, music, and art that, in spite of high artistic and technical quality, have been deprived of public exhibition in their country of production.

It is certain that such ambition may not be realized without your assistance and collaboration. To that end, we are thankful to Proctors' support in providing the opportunity to reach you, our audience. We are also grateful to you for your enthusiasm and encouragement in fostering this much needed artistic dialogue. We hope that with your help FCI will grow to become a major platform for the artistic and intellectual exchange.

The central character deals with threats real and imagined in pursuit of a score that could be life changing.




d. **Behind Sky's Fences** (Exp.), Farhad Fereshteh-Hekmat, 12 min
