Mehregan

Dedicated to Mithra, the goddess of friendship, affection, and love, Mehregan is the second most important Persian festival, falling behind Nowruz. In ancient times, Mehregan festivities started on the occasion when day and night were of equal length, corresponding to when farmers harvested their crops. However, to establish a universal beginning for this festivity, today it is celebrated on the 10th day of the month of Mehr (October 2nd). According to <u>Shahnameh</u> (Book of Kings), Mehregan was the day when the legendary king Fereydun vanquished the evil Zahhak and confined him to Mount Damavand. Therefore, it is also thought of the day on which oppressed people will overcome their oppressors. The Persian speaking communities and cultures celebrate Mehregan by coming together to give thanks for the blessings they have received in the months past and what they will acquire in the days to come. They wear colorful clothes, dance, eat especially prepared delicacies, and exchange gifts with friends and family.
